

ARTIST'S STATEMENT



"On a Day of Resting, Creator Sets Free (Jesus) and his followers were walking through a field of grain. The men were hungry, so as they walked they plucked some grain to eat." (Mark 2:23, FNV)

Make it available. Painted on paper with acrylic paint, this portrayal of the harvest imagines one of the disciples gathering the grain. The brush strokes in the foreground are bigger and more realistic, as they recede, the grain stalks are smaller and become more like the texture of the background.

The wheat field offers a sense of endless abundance here, yet the religious leader sets exclusionary rules. In our present day, fencing the table is one such exclusionary tactic. The Incarnate God reminds us in this text that God is not a part of these exclusionary concepts, God is calling us to the endless repetition of the wheat disappearing into the distance: the endless repetition of welcome, of abundance, of healing love, of Sabbath rest.

"Human beings were not made for the Day of Resting. Instead the Day of Resting was made for human beings. So, then, the True Human Being is Chief over the Day of Resting." (Mark 2:27-28, FNV)
