### **ARTIST'S STATEMENT**

"And they were filled with great fear and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?" (Mark 4:41, NRSVUE) There was a recent tornado in the Black Mountain area. A father saved his child by responding to the notification in time and sheltering with the whole family in the basement, truly miraculous. Painting this storm in full acrylic color on canvas, the brush stroke gives energy to the scene. In the mountains the brush stroke varies to offer a sense of closely defined textures right before us, while blurring that which is far away. It is a way of creating a foreground, middle ground, and background in the image. The brush stroke in the clouds is full of texture again, pulling it forward toward the viewer, menacing, and beautiful in its power. Like the disciples, fear often takes the forefront in our decision making. May God's voice bring the calm. "And waking up, he rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Be silent! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm." (Mark 4:39, NRSVUE)
