ARTIST'S STATEMENT

"...and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." (Luke 3:22, NRSVUE) Using the paper lace process, this art piece represents the descending dove; the Holy Spirit at Jesus' baptism. When I began work on this design the prevailing images of doves descending in their mass-produced forms were prevalent in my visual mind. I have loved these and struggled with them over the years. For this image, I wanted to find one that was diving. My first sketch was too vertical. Terrible, particularly for this horizontal space. It took much research to discover a dove pose that truly represented the gravitas of this incredible scriptural moment. This moment when God's voice names and claims Jesus as the Messiah. Unfathomable. Here the dove descends forward toward the people reminding us that it is not just Jesus who has been baptized; who has been claimed and named; who has been called. The other motifs in this piece are Celtic symbols representing the trinity and the verticality of a wall. The Holy Spirit, the voice of God, and Jesus in human form, all parts of the trinity are actively present here. The dove breaks through the wall, this barrier connecting those once divided. Beloved, who/what/how is God calling you to connect? What barriers must be traversed, broken, overcome?
