

We trust in God, whom Jesus called Abba, Father. In sovereign love God created the world good and makes everyone equally in God's image, of every race and people, to live as one community.


But we rebel against God; we hide from our Creator.

We deserve God's condemnation.



This sung prayer's words come from Jonah 2: the prayer Jonah makes from within the belly of the whale.


## Offerings
