FROM THE PRESIDENT

WILDERNESS HIKING PROGRAM

The Ranger staff will offer two public hikes each Tuesday and Thursday during the conference season. There will be three Saturday full-day trips. Hikes will leave at 9:00am (unless otherwise noted) from the Nature Center located just below the Lake Susan dam. Half-day hikes are designed to return in time for Clubs pick-up at noon; full-day hikes will return mid to late afternoon. Wear sturdy, well-broken-in hiking shoes and bring water, snacks, and for longer hikes, a lunch. All hikes are free and open to the public. You must be 13 or older to attend a hike without an adult guardian. In the event of inclement weather, hikes may be altered, truncated, or cancelled. Please feel free to call the Nature Center at 828.669.9540 to check on trail conditions or hike cancellations.

Before you hike on your own, please come by the Nature Center or the Montreat Store for trail maps and advice. Remember to always file a "flight plan" with someone who is not hiking with you and follow it. Always bring food and water and wear appropriate clothing.

PACE GUIDELINES FOR HIKES:

Leisurely: There is no time crunch for this hike.

Moderate: This hike can afford a few non-scheduled stops.

Fast: This hike must leave on time; hikers may need to walk briskly to get back on time.

Full Day: East Ridge Ramble-Pace: moderate with a few strenuous sections; 6 miles total; 1,700 ft. gain.

From the Nature Center we'll ascend the Lookout Trail and then travel along the East Ridge all the way to Long Gap. In the process, we'll cross Lookout, Boggs' Bunion, Brushy, and Rocky Head. We will take the Trestle to Potts Cove Gap, and then return to Montreat via the Graybeard Trail.

Half Day: Toll Road Tour-Pace: moderate, easy hike

Full Day: Hydroelectric Tour—Pace: moderate with several very steep sections; 4.8 miles total; 1,800 ft. gain We will ascend Graybeard Trail to the site of the old Montreat reservoir which provided water for the hydroelectric plant which served Montreat until the early 1930s. We'll continue on to Potts Cove, then head south along the Trestle Road to Long Gap, where we will take the East Ridge Trail south to the summit of Rocky Head. We will descend on the Rocky Head trail, passing the old holding ponds, descend to the Montreat Campground, and then back to the Nature Center.

THURSDAY JUNE 20, 2019

Half Day: Walden's Rock Out-and-Back-Pace: fast, moderate hike

Full Day: West Ridge—Pace: strenuous and remote; strong hikers only; 11.1 miles total; 3,000 ft. gain After warming up on the Stomping Knob trail, we'll head north along the West Ridge all the way to Graybeard. After eating lunch we'll return to Montreat via the Graybeard Trail. Long pants and stout boots are recommended in this wild country where poison ivy, bears, and rattlesnakes are not uncommon.
