## WILDERNESS HIKING PROGRAM

The Ranger staff will offer two public hikes each Tuesday and Thursday during the summer conference season. There will be three Saturday full-day trips. Hikes will leave at 9:00am (unless otherwise noted) from the Nature Center located just below the Lake Susan dam. Please arrive by 8:50am. Half-day hikes are designed to return in time for Clubs pick-up at noon; full-day hikes will return mid to late afternoon. Wear sturdy, well-broken-in hiking shoes and bring water, snacks, and for longer hikes, a lunch. All hikes are free and open to the public. You must be 13 or older to attend a hike without an adult guardian. In the event of inclement weather, hikes may be altered, truncated, or cancelled. Please feel free to call the Nature Center at 828.669.9540 to check on trail conditions or hike cancellations.

Before you hike on your own, please come by the Nature Center or the Montreat Store for trail maps and advice. Remember to always file a "flight plan" with someone who is not hiking with you and follow it. Always bring food and water and wear appropriate clothing.

#### PACE GUIDELINES FOR HIKES:

*Leisurely:* There is no time crunch for this hike.

Moderate: This hike can afford a few non-scheduled stops.

Fast: This hike must leave on time; hikers may need to walk briskly to get back on time.

Half Day: Lookout Loop-Pace: Moderate

Full Day: The "Top O' the Valley" Hike-Pace: Strenuous; 9.3 miles total; 3,000 ft. gain.

From the Nature Center we'll walk up to the family campground and then up the Rocky Head Trail to the top of Rocky Head. After a quick rest we'll head North to Potts Cove Gap, follow the Trestle switchbacks to Walker's Knob, and then on to the top of Graybeard. After lunch, we'll travel down the West Ridge to Big Piney and then return to Montreat on the Big Piney Ridge Trail.

THURSDAY ...... AUGUST 1, 2019

#### No Half Day hike today

Full Day: Pinnacle-Pace: Moderate with strenuous sections; 16.4 miles total; 3,300 ft. gain.

The second longest hike of the summer takes us to Pinnacle Mountain, just south of the Blue Ridge Parkway near the entrance to Mount Mitchell State Park. We'll take the Graybeard Trail to the foot of Graybeard Mountain, walk along the Mitchell Toll Road all the way to the Parkway, and then double back along the ridge line to Pinnacle. We'll have a leisurely lunch at the top with plenty of time to take in the excellent view (and a nap), and then return via the Toll Road to Buck Gap, Lookout Trail, and home. Be sure to bring rain gear and plenty of water.
